Spiritual Discipline of Focus: Waiting and Simplicity

Suggested practices:

- Light a candle in your window to remind you that God is our light and our home and that we are the light of hope in a world that is sometimes dark.
- Take a few moments to wait in the still and quiet each day. Listen for sounds your busy mind may have missed. Do you hear birds, traffic, kids? Ask God for quiet ways to interact with those things that surround you.
- Listen to a Christmas carol that has been meaningful to you. Think about how the music and lyrics connect you to Christ in his earthly coming.
- When in a public space, choose one person to really look at and ask the Holy Spirit to show you how that person is an image of Christ.
- * Family* Talk about what neighbors or people you come across may need a connection of hope to God and his people. Consider making them a Christmas card, cookies or small gift.
